LAST MONTH MEETING—JAN. 15TH— BYO WORKSHOP AT THE TEANECK GREENHOUSE

What a surprise there was at the last meeting. I expected to write a lead sentence stating that the club had established a new attendance record for a January session, a new low one that is. After all we were meeting in Teaneck rather than Closter and finding the place is a bit of a challenge. But despite the change, six people found their way there and we actually had a pretty good workshop based on two types of succulents which can be used as very good beginning level material.

The two succulents' species are Portulacaria (elephant bush) and Crassula Portulacea (shrek ears or finger jade). They are not new as bonsai material and they have a number of good traits to recommend them. They are easy to grow from cuttings, fast growing, tolerant to drying out, grow well as tropicals indoors in the winter have relativity small leaves and they also can make pretty good looking bonsai as well. So I think these two succulents deserve our attention and effort.

At the January 15 workshop some of these jade like cuttings I had started last summer were distributed. They were rooted and had grown into proto- bonsai about six inches tall with 3/4 inch thick trunks. They needed pruning (cuttings were immediately replanted) and some wiring, but in a fairly short time I hope to see them back at a meeting for further refinement. All of us agreed that these bonsai should continue to be thought of as club trees that are being developed for future club use, but I suspect that those that turn out well will be hard to get back.

FERTILIZER MEETING

There are many aspects to creating good bonsai, and fertilizing them properly and sufficiently is one of most neglected and yet important of these aspects. If you ask successful growers what they do or use, you will get back lots of responses, so there are many things that may work, but some of these systems work better than others. At our next meeting Peter Sobel will be a leading a workshop in which you will try out his method and take home as much fertilizer as you care to make. According to Peter we waste much of the fertilizer that we apply because it rapidly runs out of the drainage holes. The method that he will introduce us to is better for our trees and our finances.

Peter has taken a 50 pound bag of a basic fertilizer mix and added Tree Tone, Azomite, neem seed meal, humic acid and bio-tone starter to produce a super charged mixture. His delivery system for this brew is to fill high quality tea bags with it and seal each bag. That's our part. During each watering of our trees, only a small amount of this rich mixture dissolves and is released into the soil, ensuring a steady low level of feeding, with little waste. Make as many bags as you want, he has 5000 of them. We have decided that each one will cost 10 cents.I think this is a really good idea, worth trying.

This meeting will also be the dead line for submitting nominations for Bergen Bonsai's Board of Directors. Any paid member may run in the election be held at the March meeting.

Did I mention the bonsai artists yet? Bill Baddeley, Boon Manakitivipart and Akio Kondo are big names in the bonsai world and just breathing the same air and using the same public toilet can make you too a better bonsai artist. Of cause, if you have real bonsai in

your soul, you can go full bore and for a mere \$160 attend the whole works all weekend. When you do register at any level you help increase our club's share of any surplus funds which hopefully will be left over after the festival.
