<u>LAST MONTH MEETING—FEB. 19TH— BYO WORKSHOP AT THE TEANECK</u> GREENHOUSE

Our February meeting at the Teaneck Greenhouse was really good. It was all about fertilizer, which along with growing medium is the essential element in growing and keeping our trees healthy. As promised in the Feb newsletter, Peter brought a bucket full of a fertilizer mix that he made using the following recipe:

1) 4 cups of Tree Tone (62.7 %)

Tree Tone by Espoma is an organic 6-3-2

2) 2 cups of Bio Tone (33.1 %)

Bio Tone also by Espoma is a "starter" added during repotting and is 4-3-3

- 3) 2 tbs humic acid (2 %)
- 4) 2 tbs Azomite a trace mineral rich material (2%)
- 5) 2 tbs silica very finely ground (2%)

Clearly many other formulations can be successful, however, when I drank a single cup of this mixture as a tea, within 15 minutes I turned green, had roots growing from the tips of my fingers and then sprouted leaves from my nose. The effects on plants however are more subtle.

There were 12 of us and we filled empty tea bags with the mix and sealed the bag ends with hair heating irons (at least 60 watts). The group made about 1100 bags and could have been much more productive if we had more irons. We each paid 10 cents a bag for materials costs. Each bag leaches fertilizer for about a month. There is considerable effort in making a large quantity of these slow release bags but the ease and dependability of keeping our plants well fed may be worth it. There is still a large quantity of mixture left over for members wishing to try out this system. Thank you, Peter for a great job.

See about 50 outstanding trees in the exhibit and gain access to 20 or so vendors, all for as little as \$20 for same day walk in's. \$120 (lunch included) buys entry to either Friday evening or Sunday morning AND all day Saturday, which is the best day to observe four bonsai demonstration trees being made with the opportunity to win them and/or attend a critique of the exhibit by one of the three internationally known artists, who are the center of the festival. Did I mention the bonsai artists yet? Bill Baddeley, Boon Manakitivipart and Akio Kondo are big names in the bonsai world and just breathing the same air and using the same public toilet can make you too a better bonsai artist. Of cause, if you have real bonsai in

your soul, you can go full bore and for a mere \$160 attend the whole works all weekend. When you do register at any level you help increase our club's share of any surplus funds which hopefully will be left over after the festival.
